# It's All About Respect



- Points of Emphasis
  - Fair play and respect are the backbone of any successful amateur sports program
  - It is imperative that all participants and spectators have respect for all players, coaches, officials
  - Players are encouraged to develop a deep sense of respect for all (opponents and officials)
- Coach's Code of Conduct
  - Never verbally or physically abuse a player or official
- Player's Code of Conduct
  - Řespect your coach, your teammates, your parents, opponents and officials
  - Never argue with an official's decision
- Zero Tolerance Policy
  - A minor penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct (zero tolerance) shall be assessed whenever a player <u>openly</u> disputes or argues any decision by an official.

#### 601(a) Abuse of Officials and Other Misconduct



- Unsportsmanlike Conduct minor penalty
  - Disputes the rulings of any official
  - Taunts or incites an opponent
  - Creates a disturbance during the game
  - Shoots the puck after the whistle, if in the opinion of the Official such shot was avoidable
- "Disputes" can be confusing and open for interpretation

# Classifying a Dispute



- Personal attack
  - This is a blatant lack of respect
  - Listen for the pronouns "you" or "your"
  - Players: Misconduct penalty
  - Coaches: Bench minor
  - Have a low threshold for player/coach to official attacks
  - If a personal attack comes from the player's bench and the player is not identifiable, assess a bench minor
- Frustration
  - Not a personal attack
  - Usually pertains to a call or interpretation
  - Minor penalty (think zero tolerance)
  - Don't allow frustration to turn personal
- Be able to differentiate between the two

## Shooting The Puck After A Whistle



- As an extension of play, if the shot was avoidable
  - Dangerous, but not disrespectful
  - Minor penalty
- Shooting it out of the reach of an official who is retrieving it
  - Make sure the player isn't actually trying to be helpful (e.g. at completion of icing or intentional offsides)
  - Blatantly disrespectful
  - Misconduct penalty

## Physical Contact



- Intentional (non-incidental) physical contact between a player and official must be penalized
  - Blatantly disrespectful
  - Must be initiated by the player
  - Misconduct penalty at a minimum
  - Examples
    - Shooting the puck at an official
    - Slashing an official during a face-off
    - Pushing official during an altercation

## Escalation Path For Abuse



#### Player

- 1. Minor
- 2. Misconduct
- 3. Game misconduct
- 4. Warning to the captain, 15 seconds
- 5. Bench minor for delay of game, 15 seconds
- 6. Suspend the game & match penalty

#### Coach

- 1. Bench minor
- 2. Game misconduct
- 3. Warning to the captain, 15 seconds
- 4. Bench minor for delay of game, 15 seconds
- 5. Suspend the game & match penalty
